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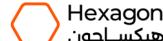


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Introduction

The **Qatar Investment and Innovation Conference**, co-organized by The Business Year and Msheireb Properties, will be host to the AI for Good Qatar Challenge, a start-up competition that showcases GCC-based innovators using AI to solve pressing global challenges aligned with United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The winner of the Qatar Challenge will gain exclusive one-to-one mentorship from flagship global VCs, the opportunity to pitch directly to leading venture capitalists as well as in front of Plug and Play's worldwide accelerator, The Alchemist Doha and the AI for Good YAILs Chapter in Qatar, free access to major Plug and Play global events, and a fast-tracked application to the finalist stage of global accelerator programs.

Eligibility Criteria

- There is **no entry fee** to apply.
- Only **pre-seed or seed-stage start-ups registered and operating in the GCC region** are eligible.
- Applicant companies must be **legally registered** and legally qualified to operate in their line of business at the time of application.
- Start-ups must have an **AI-native product**—AI/ML must be at the core of the solution, not just an added feature.
- Applications must demonstrate a clear **impact aligned with at least one UN Sustainable Development Goal (SDG)**.
- A **working prototype or MVP** is required.
- All shortlisted start-ups must pitch **in person** at Barahat Msheireb, Doha, on **November 3, 2025**. Remote participation is **not permitted**.
- All pitches and submitted materials must be delivered in **English** (mandatory).
- Employees of the Organizers (The Business Year, Msheireb Properties), their affiliates, subsidiaries, promotional agencies, suppliers, and immediate family members are **not eligible** to participate.
- By submitting an application, you agree to and accept the **Competition Rules** and the **Terms + Conditions** outlined in this document, and to abide by the **judges' final decisions**.

Application Information Required

Applicants will provide details in six categories:

- 1. Start-up & Team** – name, website, country, year founded, team bios, contact info.
- 2. Product & Business** – description, problem solved, AI-native explanation, stage, traction, funding, business model.
- 3. Impact & Relevance** – societal impact, GCC relevance, scalability, five-year vision.
- 4. Pitch Preparation** – prior pitch experience, four-min deck readiness, deck link, optional video.
- 5. Motivation & Participation** – reasons for joining, expected benefits, availability to pitch live.
- 6. Declarations** – confirm AI-native, seed stage, product ready, acceptance of rules.

- **Pitch Length:** 3min.
- **Rounds:** One round per Start-up.
- **Winner Announcement:** Closing session at ~7:20 PM.

- Organizers, Mentors, Judges, and anyone involved in the competition agree to respect the confidentiality of submissions in accordance with these Terms.
- All application information will be treated as confidential, except for publicly available content (e.g., company description, website link, logos).
- Applicants may be asked to provide logos, profiles, and/or materials for use on official event channels, websites, and social media.
- Judges and mentors will have access to submitted decks and materials under confidentiality obligations.



Data

- Organizers will strive to maintain accurate and up-to-date data but cannot guarantee accuracy or completeness of information derived from applicant submissions.

Prizes and Benefits

- There is no cash prize for the Qatar competition.

Tax and Legal Considerations

- Organizers hold no responsibility for any tax or legal obligations arising from participation or benefits obtained through the program.

Event Format Changes

- In the event of force majeure (including but not limited to public health emergencies, natural disasters, war, or government actions), the Organizers may, at their discretion, move the AI for Good Qatar Challenge to a virtual format.

Cancellation

- The Organizers reserve the right to cancel the competition at any time. If cancelled, participants waive any claims for damages against the Organizers or their partners.
